	2.1	SE Sustainability report, Emily Steward, Head of South East Clinical Senate	ES	
		<ul> <li>The presentation included the following highlights:</li> <li>how climate change impacts the NHS, from its geography, its buildings, patients, workforce, training and travel etc.</li> <li>ideas on how to reduce its carbon footprint by using a plan for net zero that looks at areas to consider.</li> <li>acknowledgement that this is difficult and there are many issues to take into account.</li> <li>how the report can be used as a guide for systems, Senate Councils and Review Panel members. It is designed to inform their approach to assessing the extent to which inequalities in the system have been understood and considered within a given clinical case for change. 		New NHS England restructure process

	BC updated the Council on the NHS England restructure, which will be completed early 2024 and confirmed the Senate support unchanged following the close of consultation. The remaining staff in roles that have been affected by change will move into the filling of posts process within the NEY Regional Team in October and November with staff who have not secured a role at that point being able to apply into vacancies in other Regions or National Teams in January 2024.  Some of the features of the new structure of the NHSE NEY Region related to North East & North Cumbria are the TUPE transfer of the Northern Cancer Alliance into the NENC ICB and the consolidation of NENC Clinical Network support teams into a set of NEY-wide Clinical Programme teams.		
	Clinical Co-dependency Framework		
	BC updated the group that the South East Clinical Senate will soon be issuing a revised version of their 2014 publication "Clinical Co-dependency of an Acute Hospital Framework".		
	The original 2014 publication is one of the core documents used by service change programmes in considering the implications of service change in acute settings on other co-dependent services. It can be highly useful in both the clinical model development stage and the clinical assurance role undertaken by clinical senates, so this update and re-issue is welcomed.		
	BC will circulate the re-issued framework when published and will invite the SE Senate Council manager to speak about it at a future council meeting.		
2.3	<ul> <li>Northern England Senate-led Projects</li> <li>The North West Women &amp; Children's Transformation Programme: The NE Senate has completed its part in the process and if further support is required it may be provided by another Senate next time.</li> <li>Lancashire and South Cumbria ICB new hospitals programme: The NW Senate has indicated that it will refer some of the review work associated with the L&amp;SC ICB New Hospitals programme to the NE and YH Clinical Senates. This work would likely take place in Q4 of 2023/24.</li> </ul>	AC	
2.4	<ul> <li>Northern England Senate-related Projects</li> <li>AC Chaired a meeting in York where three NEY Cancer Alliances presented proposals for meeting current challenges with workforce issues in non-surgical oncology. KE added that because of the crisis there have been some emergency measures put in place re a Hub and Spoke model, but an escalating need versus lack of workforce is an issue that has been highlighted.</li> <li>AC has also been involved in a review of paediatric services at an organisation within the North East.</li> </ul>	AC
